**Teaching Playwriting in Schools - Learning to Give**

- This is a very important step in understanding how the play and its several elements work
- Theater is a "live" experience We encourage you to set some time aside for bringing their plays to life, whether it is just a reading or if it is fully staged Remind the students that, in the end, it's their play
